

Indiana Junior Club Lamb Circuit
Sanctioned Show Information

The Indiana Junior Club Lamb Circuit (IJCLC) welcomes you as a potential sanctioned show. The IJCLC sets forth a set of guidelines in which all shows must follow. Please read below the regulations for becoming a sanctioned show and initial next to each. Next, fill out the form attached and send both forms back to qualify for sanctioning. Any show that sent forms in for the 2009 show circuit will be accepted on a first come first serve basis for dates from 12:00am on January 1st through 12:00am March 1st. Any show that did file a form in 2009 may send forms in from 12:00am February 1st through 12:00am March 1st and will also be accepted on a first come first serve basis for dates.

Guidelines

- _____ All shows must be from May 1st through August 1st in 2010.
- _____ All shows must be conducted on weekends (Saturday or Sunday), including check-in times. (You may include check-in times on weekdays; however, exhibitors must still be able to check-in on the weekend date for at least a 2 hour time period)
- _____ There will be a maximum of two shows sanctioned per day, therefore four sanctioned shows per weekend. (Double-header shows are considered as two shows)
- _____ Two sanctioned shows in two separate locations in one day will only be allowed if the shows are located less than 60 miles apart. The first show must start before noon and the second show must allow ample time after the completion of the first show and accept exhibitors from the first show. (The IJCLC representative will make this call as to the time frame allotted.)
- _____ Shows may or may not require lambs to pen in barns during shows, however if there are requirements for an overnight stay, lambs must be allowed to return to trailers during the overnight for personal supervision. (Many exhibitors prefer showing out of trailers to save on bedding cost.)
- _____ All shows must have access to a computer with an Excel program during the show. Shows **must** use the Excel spreadsheet given by the IJCLC. This spreadsheet must be saved and given to the IJCLC representative at the conclusion of the show (a disk will be provided). Results on the spreadsheets must be double checked for accuracy. Inaccurate information given to the IJCLC will result in a \$25 sanctioned show penalty. This is to ensure that exhibitors are receiving the proper points for the circuit.
- _____ All shows must use the cards given by the IJCLC. These cards must be organized and given back to the IJCLC representative at the conclusion of the show. If your show is a double header, cards must be divided into separate groups and labeled "A" and "B" for the two shows.

All shows are required to pay a sanctioned show fee of \$1 per head (market lambs and commercial ewes only) at the conclusion of the show. If check is not received at this time, your show will be charged an additional \$25 for each week that it is late.

All shows must show market lambs by breeds. A minimum of 5 lambs are required for a breed to have its own class. If less than 5 lambs of a particular breed are registered at a show, these lambs will be placed in an AOB (All Other Breeds) class. Although lambs may be shown in an AOB class, they still must be documented and assigned a specific breed on the cards and Excel spreadsheet for IJCLC point purposes. The following are common breeds that are likely exhibited at sanctioned shows: Dorset, Hampshire, Natural Color, Oxford, Shropshire, Southdown, White-faced Crossbred/Speckle/Brockle, Black-faced Crossbred, and Suffolk. (Note: White-faced Crossbred/Speckle/Brockle do not exhibit amongst Black-faced Crossbreds)

For the market lamb divisions, a top 5 overall must be selected at the conclusion of the show (grand champion drive). These are to be selected from the breed champions and reserve breed champions. See the official bylaws for complete rules on selection. ****New for 2010****

All shows must offer a Commercial Ewe show (regardless of numbers entered). This includes both yearlings and ewe lambs. All commercial ewes must be weighed and broken down by weights into classes. Shows may also offer other breeds for a ewe show, however, the IJCLC does not need this information documented. The commercial ewe can show for a supreme ewe if other breeds are offered. Regardless, a champion and reserve commercial ewe must be selected (yearlings vs. ewe lambs).

All shows must offer four showmanship divisions with champions and reserve champions selected from each division. Divisions are as follows: Novice—grades K-2, Junior—grades 3-5, Intermediate—grades 6-8, and Senior—grades 9-12 plus up to age 21. All grades and ages are as of January 1st of the current year. (Shows may also offer a Pee-Wee division for those younger than Kindergarten age, however, no documentation needs to be made for the IJCLC)

Shows must try to break class sizes as evenly as possible. Class sizes should not go below 7 (unless that is the only class) and should not exceed 13. (Theoretically, if there is 14, classes should be broken into 7 and 7). Please see the IJCLC representative if you have any questions.

Shows must try to avoid utilizing the same judges in a single show season. Shows must provide their judge's name as earlier as possible to the IJCLC and avoid hiring already selected judges from other shows in the current season. (A list of selected judges will be sent via email as they become available. Your judge selection must be given to the IJCLC no later than March 1st.

All shows must read and follow the IJCLC Official Bylaws. (See our website for the most updated Bylaws.)
